

### **Report from Intermediate Camp**

A total of 47 campers (21 girls, 26 boys) attended Intermediate Camp. We studied the life of Noah as described in Genesis chapters 5-9. Stephen Campbell gave the morning lectures, which were designed to convey the truth of Scripture in an understandable way to address the needs of 11- to-13-year-olds. We were all stunned by the immense size of the ark when the dimensions were illustrated on the playing field. The gospel was preached each evening and one camper made a profession of salvation while at least four others stayed behind for counseling. Another camper recommitted himself to Christ in the presence of his counselor.



The topic of Noah, the ark, and the flood generated several very interesting conversations between campers and

### Report from Senior Weekend - Road Rally



Three of Berg's E-Gran Tour pedal karts were the centerpiece of our Fall Senior Weekend Road Rally during October 17-19, 2014. This was the first time Mountain View's camp programs had ever used Berg karts, and there was not one ounce of disappointment.

For two-plus hours during the weekend, our 23 teen campers fulfilled their pedal-kart dreams on an exhilarating race course. Rick, our activities director, used sports field marking paint to design a relay-style course through Mountain View's wooded area of tall pines.

Rick projected a sketch of the route on the wall so the whole group knew what was coming; then he divided the campers into three teams. Two riders per kart raced against the clock, navigating along straight paths, around cabins, and across pine-needle terrain. At various checkpoints, they jumped out of the kart to complete physical challenges while their teammates hopped in and continued on the course, racing through tree lines to reach the finish. Along the way, the camp staff met campers with smoke bombs and a hailstorm of foam balls, adding to the drama.

When the organized relays were done, the staff had their turn, with the campers gladly



pelting counselors with foam balls as well. And later in the weekend, during other free moments, campers headed for the karts to get in another run. The EGran Tour pedal karts were a definite highlight of our program during Fall Senior Weekend 2014!

Mountain View thanks Berg for the opportunity to try

these karts, and we are happy to recommend them to any camping or youth programs that might be considering a Berg kart activity for their group. They're fun to ride, fun to watch, and a guaranteed success for any age.

**Up-date of "The Plan" for Future Projects** 

For I know the plans I have for you," says the LORD. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope. In those days when you brav. I will listen.

-JEREMIAH 29:11-12 NLT

Mountain View Bible Camp turned 46 this past October. I am grateful to know that God has good plans for us, plans for a future and a hope. He surely has blessed this ministry over the years by providing campers, staff, rental groups, volunteers, health, safety, direction, finances... Even though we have made some plans. He has directed us, modifying some of those plans, refocusing some of those plans, erasing some plans and arranging the timing of others.

The present - Bath House Pavilion Project: During Fall Senior Weekend (October 17-19, 2014), the pavilion portion of this structure was able to be used for the Friday night activities. Campers and staff gathered to enjoy a snack, video and nearby camp fire. Though this building still requires completion of the change rooms, rest rooms and storage area, it is a joy to see some of the benefits this new facility will provide.

Though construction is still in progress, we are thankful that all the funds needed to complete it are now in hand. Juggling between the necessary maintenance projects, monthly and seasonal task items, new construction, scheduled camps and rentals (requiring set-up, clean-up and food service), there is no lack of things to do. With the Lord's help, we plan to complete the Bath House Pavilion before May of 2015.

The future - Up-Dating of "The Plan": The plan is to complete the bathhouse pavilion already under construction (Praise the Lord - All funds are in hand!) near the pool, maintain the Stony Pine Activity Center and Hardwood Lodge dorm which are in need of vinyl siding (\$ 9,000 funds still needed), window



replacement (\$6,000 funds still needed) and restroom remodeling (\$8,000 funds still needed).

There has been some progress made in preparation to construct two additional duplex cabins (\$85,000 per duplex). Originally, we had planned to start one this past October. That plan had to be modified partly because the Bath House Pavilion project is not complete, but also due to lack of funds and available manpower. We do have building permits in hand for both additional duplexes, but not the funds. The full time staff and Board have agreed to hold off until September 2015 to break ground, and then only proceed if the funds are in place.

**Financial Need:** As the Lord supplies the needed funds and manpower, we will proceed with construction and maintenance projects. Knowing that Missions-In-Focus (our largest attended program) is scheduled for August 8-14, 2015, we plan to have the Bath House Pavilion finished and, most if not all, the Hardwood Lodge and Activity Center projects complete. We kindly ask you to pray with us for wisdom regarding how quickly we can proceed with these projects. If you have time and would like to come and help with any or all of these projects, please let us know, so we can schedule accordingly.

Thank you for your prayers and interest in this area of the Lord's work.
