Dear friends of Mountain View Bible Camp,

Fall has arrived and the foliage is beautiful. I am thankful to live at camp and enjoy the uniqueness of all four seasons. Though the soon arrival of winter is not as enjoyable as the other three seasons, it does allow for the staff to step back from the busy interactions with campers, staff and guest groups to focus on certain projects that are not as easy to complete when programs happen on the hill. Just like many of your normal days in life, camp life is generally busy regardless of the season.

We are grateful for the extra busy year of camp programs. The summer was full and many of the spring and fall weekends were



occupied. God has truly blessed camp with great facilities, and with this blessing comes great responsibilities. Maintenance goes on all year long, though some years we need to tackle larger projects. Some of those projects are shared in a letter from the Board of Trustees included in this newsletter.

One of the items shared in the Board letter was the need to purchase a good used skid steer type machine. That purchase has been made and paid for in full. Before we even decided to move forward with this purchase, the Lord was preparing hearts to give toward this need. I am encouraged to see how God works in leading camp in making decisions and then confirming those decisions by providing the finances to make it happen. One Board member reminds us often that "God's work done God's way will not lack God's provision."

As the team also ages and physical limitations grow, should the Lord tarry, additional full time staff will be necessary to continue the ministry of Mountain View Bible Camp. We invite you to join us in praying that the Lord of the harvest will raise up those He will call and equip for His service here on the hill. MVBC is His and we

Dear brothers and sisters.

We send warm Christian greetings along with some updates about the Lord's work at Mountain View Bible Camp. A review of the 2024 spring and summer season brings many encouraging notes to report. Most camp sessions saw an increase in attendance compared to last year. A number of campers gave their lives to the Lord Jesus as Savior, while others spoke with counselors and staff for the assurance of their salvation or to deepen their walk with Christ. There were several baptisms as well.

In addition, some new rental groups came to Mountain View. In August, the biennial Missions in Focus session also took place, and by many accounts this was a special year at MIF with the theme of revival. It is always a blessing to know that the camp facility is being used by the Lord.

As the Board and full-time staff look ahead, some significant equipment and maintenance needs are on the horizon, addressing the safety and efficiency of the camp program and facility. We would like to share these needs with you for your prayers and consideration.

#### 1) Storm water management

Storm water runoff currently impacts the camp road and other parts of the property. Some improvements have been made in recent years, but further work is needed to divert water away from buildings and prime usage areas. The recommended improvements will cost about \$30,000, with camp staff doing as much of the work as possible in-house to save additional expenses.

2) A used skid steer tractor (Bobcat type) This need is related to the first. A used skid steer will allow camp to do much of its own grading and earth-moving work instead of renting or hiring equipment at high rates. It will also be a great help in the much-needed continual maintenance of the camp road. A quality used skid steer will cost about \$25,000.

#### 3) A camp bus replacement

The third need addresses one of Mountain View's highest priorities, which is camper safety. The time has come to replace the camp bus. The current bus is 33 years old. New models offer significant improvements in both safety and fuel efficiency. After evaluating current options, the Board believes the best option is a model costing about \$140,000.

These ministry needs obviously come with some larger-ticket costs, but we are mindful of the necessity to be good stewards with all that has been entrusted to us. We are sure that God's work done in God's way will not lack God's resources. We thank you for your support and interest in Mountain View over the years, and we desire your prayers for us as we await the Lord's timing and provision for these improvements


Great lessons about the cows of the Bible, too. They show us that we can trust God, serve Him, and enjoy what Jesus has done to provide a relationship with Him.


