CALLING ALL VOLUNTEERS!

Do you have a desire to help at camp?
Well, what are you waiting for? If you are waiting for a special invitation,
HERE IT IS!

I recently spoke with a number of individuals who expressed a desire to serve at camp but had not completed the back ground screening process. Once someone is 18 years of age or older, the background screening is mandatory in order to serve at any camp session hosting campers under the age of 18.

So why wait to get this process done? If you wait until the camp session is almost here, you will be too late. The process may take a few weeks to hear back from all 3 agencies. *Please do not delay - start the screening today!*

Dear Friends of Mountain View,

The State of Pennsylvania has mandated background screening for all individuals wishing to work with children. Mountain View Bible Camp has implemented a screening package. If you have resided in the State of Pennsylvania for the past ten or more years, you are required to complete the first two screening requirements. All other individuals are required to complete the FBI Finger Printing as well.

REQUIRED SCREENINGS INCLUDE:

Criminal History Record check — obtained from the PA State Police -FREE Child Abuse Clearance — obtained through the PA Dept. of Public Welfare - FREE Federal Criminal History Record — obtained from the FBI - \$27.50 paid by MVBC

A good number of staff (Directors, Counselors, Food Service, Activities Staff, Nurses, etc.) have completed these required screenings. We would like to continue to enlarge our volunteer staff pool by having more individuals complete the screening process. If you are interested in serving at Mountain View Bible Camp in any capacity, please do not delay starting this process as it may take some time to complete all three steps. These clearances can also be used by the individual with any other ministry in Pennsylvania for a period of 5 years. To begin this process, please e-mail Jon Stassel at jstassel@yahoo.com . A helpful step-by-step instruction sheet, including fee waiver codes, will be e-mailed to guide you through the process.

SPECIAL REQUEST: Staff that have completed all the required screening procedures must be sure to forward electronic and/or paper copies of those files to MVBC as soon as complete. MVBC is required to have them on file. Thank you for your help in this matter.

Please share this information with those presently serving, encourage others to consider serving, and pray for the Lord's blessing at MVBC.

Up-date of "The Plan" for Future Projects

THE PRESENT:

Duplex cabin 2 & 3: During the fall, winter and spring months, work has progressed on both buildings. However, since February, our focus has shifted to working solely on Duplex 2. The goal of completing both structures before the summer has proven to be too high of a goal. We have found that there is a lot of detail in these buildings requiring coordination with heating contractors, sprinkler system contractors and building inspectors. We are now concentrating our efforts on having Duplex 2 usable by the Missions-In-Focus program in August.

THE FUTURE:

Up-Dating of "The Plan":

Other major projects are currently on hold while we focus on the Duplex Cabins. The Hardwood Lodge dorm which has also been in need of vinyl siding (\$ 3,000 funds still needed), window replacement (\$5,000 funds still needed) and restroom remodeling (\$8,000 funds still needed) is a work in progress. Additional insulation and new siding are completed on the front wall, leaving 3 walls to insulate and side. A few other projects have surfaced this spring which required immediate attention. These projects included a new fence around the pool, a chest freezer and replacing an ice machine head.

Financial Need: The current outstanding financial need to

complete both duplex units is \$75,000.

As the Lord supplies the needed funds, we will proceed

with construction and maintenance projects. We kindly ask you to pray with us for wisdom regarding how quickly we can proceed.

Manpower Need: We deeply appreciate volunteers who come and offer their time and expertise. We desire to continue to work on both duplex buildings requiring electrical, plumbing, drywall, and inside and outside finishing.




Please pray for the safety of those who are doing this work now and also for the future use of these buildings during summer camp programs and beyond.

Online Registration, Early Registration and PAPER FORM RATES FOR 2017

Mountain View Bible Camp has partnered with CampDocs.com allowing for campers to now register online. This venture has already been a real blessing. A good number of campers used this option and for them registering for a future camp program will require only a few simple clicks.

For first time users, the total registration process does take about 15 minutes to complete per camper (depending on the speed of your internet connection). It does require all the information already requested on the current paper form, allows for a payment plan and electronic signature, and remembers the information for the future. It does allow for the transfer of electronic immunization records right into the system as a pdf or jpg file.

Camp has also begun an Early Rate and Standard Rate fee structure for Online registration as well as a Paper Form Rate. The Early Rate is available to campers registering two or more weeks before the scheduled camp session and paying the entire fee before a camp session begins. For the summer programs, this could save an average of \$30 per camp session. The early rate is automatically calculated when a camper registers on line at least two weeks before the camp session. For those registering via a paper form, the rate will be higher than the on-line rate. Also, we no longer accept phoned in registrations or lists of people who "might attend". Your cooperation with this process is greatly appreciated.

MVBC is committed to going green as much as possible. We would encourage anyone attending to register online to help speed along this process. Please do not hesitate to contact camp if you have any questions regarding the registration process or the rate structure.

PLEASE NOTE, CampDocs.com may also reach out to those who register on line in an effort to sell vou travel insurance or medications. These items are not required by MVBC. If you choose to utilize these services, they will be charged directly to you by CampDocs.com at your own personal expense. Campers needing specific medications during a camp- session are still required to bring those to camp in their original dispensing containers.
