Thoughts from the Administrator's Desk

2024 THEME:

The Mountain Is Calling And I Must Go

I lift up my eyes to the mountains, where does my help come from? -Psalms 121:1

Dear friends of Mountain View Bible Camp,

As school is wrapping up and summer plans move into full swing, camp is preparing to receive campers and staff. It is always an exciting an extra busy time of year as we move from spring weekends into the summer full week camp programs.

Over the years, camp has been blessed to have a good stream of volunteers who give of themselves to serve. Since the pandemic, we are especially concerned with a shortage of volunteers in many areas of service throughout the United States. This trend seems to be affecting volunteers in all areas of service, not just in Christian camping. For months, the MVBC staff and others have been praying for enough lifeguards, directors, counselors, activities leaders, food service helpers, medical staff, etc... Every area of camp seems to be harder to fill. I remember a statistic from a number of years ago which shared that 80% of the work is done by 20% of the volunteers. That number has shifted to be closer to 90% of the work now being done by 10% of the volunteers.

As a young child, I remember large groups of volunteers who would come to camp to clear brush, clean, paint, pound nails ... build the facilities. Quite often now, folks who attend camp sessions kindly ask what is new. Having been on staff since January 1997, I can attest that there have been a lot of changes and improvements over the years. New construction, remodeling and maintenance all take money, but more importantly,

time and man power. As the facility grows, just the cleaning and maintaining of what the Lord has entrusted to us, takes hours each week simply to prepare for the next camp program. The MVBC staff is also aging and at times we notice some physical limitations. Should the Lord tarry, additional full time staff will be necessary to keep up with the ever growing ministry needs.

How can you help? Please prayerfully consider volunteering at camp. We need good volunteers available to the Lord for His service. We regularly lift up our eyes to this mountain:

Mountain View Bible Camp. We know our help comes from the Lord – but maybe He will use you to help us in this large work He has blessed for many years.

Please join us in praying for the staff team, for camp programs and for the equipment and maintenance needs. As the Lord, the one who is our help, provides through His people, we will continue to serve all who pass through this ministry.

Reminder: Electronic devices and cell phone use at MVBC

Camper Use

Most electronic devices should not be used at Mountain View by campers, including laptops, music devices, video game players, and similar items. Campers with such devices will be asked to give them to the camp director, who will keep them in a secure location during the camp session and return them at its conclusion.

Campers are not permitted to use earbuds or headphones during a camp session. Campers are permitted to use cell phones within the following guidelines:

- Cell phones are not permitted during lesson and discussion times. (Bible apps may be used at the discretion of the camp staff.)
- Cell phones are not permitted during mealtimes by campers or staff. (Camp staff have discretion to permit emergency use, but only outside of the dining room.)

- Cell phones should not be used during sports or other scheduled activities except for taking photos and videos.
- Cell phones may be used during scheduled free time. However, camp staff have discretion to ask campers to put phones away at any time if the need arises.
- Any camper (or staff member) who engages in inappropriate use of social media, messaging apps, or other cell phone functions will be required to relinquish the phone to the camp director or Administrator for a determined period of time. (In such a case, the camp director or Administrator will contact the camper's parent or guardian.)

Campers and staff are responsible for all personal belongings at camp. Mountain View is not liable for any damage or loss that may occur to campers' electronic items.
